Service Position Title & Term	AmeriCorps Member Full-time or Part-time Terms of Service Vary
Service Location	Food Bank of Central Louisiana (primary) Additional service locations in parishes of Allen, Avoyelles, Catahoula, Concordia, Grant, LaSalle, Alexandria, LA 71301 Natchitoches, Rapides, Sabine, Vernon, Winn.
Program Purpose	To alleviate hunger in Central Louisiana by providing access to food distribution and referral services across the eleven parishes in the Food Bank service area.
Service Position Summary	AmeriCorps Members will serve both individually and as a team to address food insecurity across Central Louisiana. Members will assist with food distribution; provide service referrals; and be responsible for participant intake, relationship management and record keeping.
Essential Functions	<ul> <li>Client intake, SNAP outreach, food distribution, service referrals. Activities take place across the 11-parish service area.</li> <li>Client well-check calls, data entry, case management, service referrals. Activities take place in the Food Bank main office.</li> <li>Pack food boxes and load trucks for mobile delivery. Activities take place in the Food Bank campus warehouses.</li> </ul>
Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities Required	<ol> <li>Ability to lift 50 pounds several times during shift.</li> <li>Operate a computer proficiently, ability to input data.</li> <li>Ability to both lead and follow; be self-directed and also take guidance/direction.</li> <li>Hold and demonstrate values in the following areas: a) strong work ethic, b) dependability/consistency, c) welcome/empathy, d) diversity, equity, and the ongoing processes therein, e) teamwork and unity, f) organizational and environmental sustainability, g) enthusiasm and passion, and h) perseverance, dedication, determination, and commitment.</li> </ol>
Qualifications	<ol> <li>Must have a high school diploma or GED.</li> <li>Experience in non-profit organizations or customer service is a plus.</li> <li>Applicants must undergo a National Service Criminal History Check (including criminal history and Sex Offence Registry) and a drug screening.</li> </ol>
Commitment Required	Members commit to completing a specified number of service hours over the course of a defined term of service, not to exceed one year, in full-time OR part-time capacity.
Orientation and Training	Members are required to attend pre-service orientation and ongoing trainings throughout the course of the term of service.

## 1. Most service will be performed outdoors at different locations. Members are Service expected to adapt to environmental and weather conditions, including temperatures Conditions ranging from cold to hot, high humidity and precipitation. 2. Some work is physically demanding, involving repetitive tasks, lifting heavy objects, or extended time in work areas without air conditioning. 3. Some service may be performed indoors in offices, sitting at a desk, making phone calls, using a computer. 4. This position will involve workday travel for service at sites across Central Louisiana. Transportation will be provided. 5. This position involves many moving pieces and learning on the spot, which will be emotionally and intellectually challenging. Members must demonstrate flexibility, persistence, compassion, civility, and commitment to service! 1. Members will participate in scheduled team meetings to discuss the program, review **Evaluation and** data, continue service learning, and review procedures and regulations as necessary. Reporting 2. Members will enter their hours served electronically each day (this will directly impact receipt of living allowance). 3. Members will receive mid-term and end-of-term evaluations. 4. Members will participate in and contribute to program debriefing. 5. Additional evaluations, surveys, or reports may be required by AmeriCorps, Volunteer Louisiana, or the Food Bank of Central Louisiana. AmeriCorps Members receive: AmeriCorps 1. Living Allowance, distributed evenly over term of service, to cover basic expenses **Program** 2. Education award, that can be used for student loans or future tuition costs **Benefits** upon successful completion of term of service only 3. Health Insurance (offered to members committing to full-time service only) 4. Loan Deferment, for most federally guaranteed student loans 5. Professional Development, transferrable skills and training 6. Connections to employer networks after the term of service 7.
