

Food Insecurity

Food insecurity is defined as not having access to enough food for an active, healthy life. Louisiana ranks fourth in the nation for overall food insecurity, and first for food insecurity among children. Natchitoches Parish exceeds Louisiana state averages.

Mobile Food Pantries in Campti and Powhatan served families with distributions on the third Thursdays of each month.

Partner Agency Programs provided 457,201 pounds of food to neighbors through food pantries, meal programs, shelters, and community services.





Three Community Gardens in Natchitoches Parish provided neighbors training and space to grow their own food.

SNAP Assistance helped **40 families** complete & submit applications for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps).
