

Mobile Food Pantries in Boyce, Flatwoods, Glenmora and Oak Hill served families with food and grocery distributions each month.

Partner Agency Programs provided 805,330 pounds of food to neighbors through their food pantries and meal services.





19 Community Gardens across the Parish provided neighbors training and space to grow their own food.

Disaster Response efforts distributed 9,496 pounds of food to sheltered evacuees after Hurricane Ida.





SNAP Assistance helped 326 families complete & submit applications for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps).
