

Food insecurity is defined as lacking access to enough food for an active, healthy life.

Louisiana ranks fourth in the nation for overall food insecurity, and first for food insecurity among children.

Feeding Families



22 Mobile Food Pantries served families with **3,020,414** pounds of food on monthly distributions.

53 Partner Agencies provided **3,198,725** pounds of food to neighbors through food pantries, meal programs, shelters, and community services.





22 Community Gardens across the region provided neighbors training and space to grow their own food.

6,206 pounds of produce grown in our **Demonstration Garden and Community Gardens** was distributed to neighbors in need.


1,112 seniors received a **fifty-pound Senior Grocery Box** each month in the Senior Program.

Volunteer Service


Volunteer service in FY22 was more than double last year's service for both volunteer hours and number of volunteers.
